Description:

Kentucky Bluegrass forms a high quality turf because of its fine, soft, glossy green leaves that cut cleanly when mowed. Bluegrass develops a dense, true sod from rhizomes but doesn't spread aggressively into unwanted areas. It is best adapted to the northern part of the transition zone. The turf canopy is soft, yet durable and can repair itself from moderate injury. The tightness of the canopy does tend to produce some thatch.

Tips for Triple Crown Bluegrass:



Watering – Keep soil moist, but not saturated until well rooted. Provide moisture for your lawn in the early part of the morning (before 10am). After established, infrequent but deep watering encourages deep rooting and produces healthy lawns that maintain color and appearance even during stress.



Mowing – Never cut more than 1/3 of the leaf blade, excess clippings can smother healthy turf. Always cut with a sharp blade. In summer months (JUN-AUG) cut at the highest recommended height to cool and shade the roots.



Fertilizer – Apply balanced fertilizer at least 3 times each year.

3 Fertilizer Applications per Year ←

Do **not** fertilize with a **nitrogen fertilizer** when daytime temperatures exceed 90 Degrees (June – August). To enhance color or leaf lustre apply a chelated iron product or milorganite.



Weed Control – We strongly recommend that you apply a pre-emergent weed control to your established lawn 3 times per year. The tight canopy of a Bluegrass lawn can be a haven for weed seed germination. 3 applications of a pre-emergent in (MAR, JUN, and OCT) can be done simultaneous to your fertilizer applications or separately. Pre-emerge annually for grassy weeds once temperatures exceed 85°.
